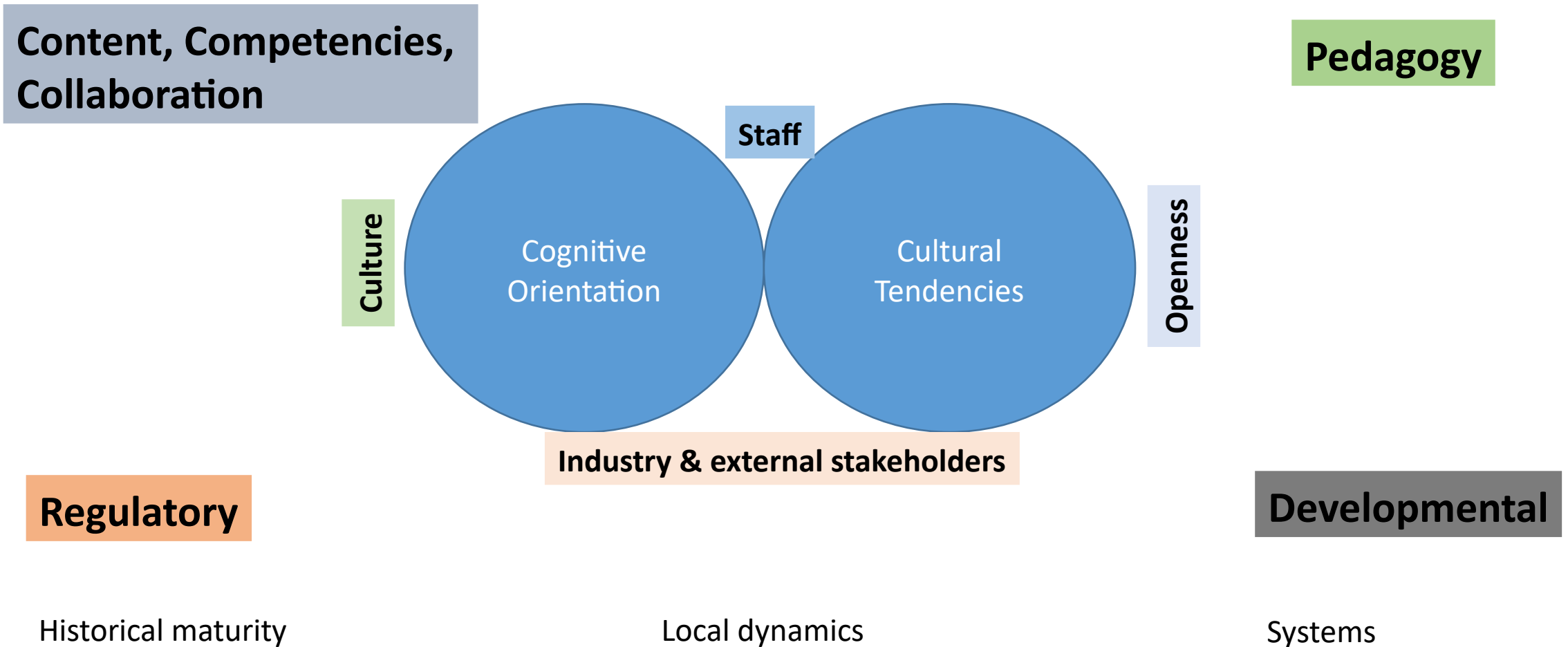


Strengthening & Expanding Internationalisation at Jagran Lakecity University

- Identify which university-Specific Advantages can be transferred to the students, faculty and overarching ecosystem.
- Assess whether our university systems can adapt to bi-directional pathways for knowledge transfer.

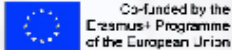

- While many a times standards are set, yet, it has been observed that educational ecosystems are not fully aware of the nuances and alignments of intended learning outcomes, competencies and assessment, their rationale & parameters.
- The objective of the meeting was to strengthen participants' understanding of Global/Internationalised Assessment Strategies and Practices, standards scope, and the rationale behind them.
