



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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY



The students may choose from one of the three undergraduate courses. These courses are interdisciplinary in nature. A unique combination of law and other disciplines viz. Humanities & Arts, Business Administration & Commerce, is offered to the students. The undergraduate courses are designed as per the mandate of the Bar Council of India (BCI). Under these curriculums, students study the compulsory subjects prescribed by BCI with elective subjects in each semester.

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

ABOUT THE COURSE:

It is a five year course comprising of ten semesters on completion of which a student earns a graduate degree in law. This course is designed to acquaint a student with the conceptual and operational parameters of general principles of law and its operation in the society. These courses help to understand how central and state governments function and how legislations are enacted and enforced. Apart from the traditional ways like lecture, assignments etc teaching pedagogy will cover up most up-to-date methods such as research, case studies, presentations and discussions.




OBJECTIVE:

ELIGIBILITY:

Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) qualification with a minimum of 50% in any discipline from a recognised board. Admission will be given based either on the CLAT/LSAT scorecard or the JLU University Entrance Exam followed by Personal Interview.





B.B.A., LL.B. (HONS.)

ABOUT THE COURSE:


The objective of the curriculum is to provide an blended knowledge of law and management. This is a gateway to the real world of management and decision-making. This course gives an insight to the students into the fundamentals of legal studies. They are exposed to basic concepts of law and legal system. Apart from the traditional ways like lecture, assignments etc teaching pedagogy will cover up most up-to-date methods such as research, case studies, presentations, mootng, discussions, and clinical legal education.

OBJECTIVE:

- Develop a deepened understanding of law in a variety of contexts
- Critically engage with the role of law in managerial practice
- Display the ability to deal with different types of legal issues and laws
- Apply critical and contextual approaches across a wide variety of subject matter
- Develop the ability to analyze, articulate and write on the subject

ELIGIBILITY:

Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) qualification with a minimum of 50% in any discipline from a recognised board. Admission will be given based either on the CLAT/LSAT scorecard or the JLU University Entrance Exam followed by Personal Interview.

LL.B.

ABOUT THE COURSE:

The degree is suited to students who wish to pursue a career in which knowledge of law and legal system is of major importance. A student passing his LL.B. Examination is deemed to be a graduate in law. It is a 3 year course comprising of six semesters.

OBJECTIVE:

- The objective of this course is to develop an understanding in the students as to the various legal aspects
- This course focuses on orientation of students to legal studies from the point of view of basic concepts of law and legal system
- A student will develop the practical knowledge of the art of communication and client interviewing skills as well
- A degree in law makes a student professionally competent to apply for legal posts in the Govt. as well as private sectors

ELIGIBILITY:

Graduation with minimum 50% in any discipline from an institute affiliated to any university recognised by UGC. Admission will be on the basis of merit, JLU Entrance Exam and Personal Interview.



LL.M.

ABOUT THE COURSE:

The post-graduate course in law is aimed at providing advanced education and training to law graduates. The curriculum is diligently designed to cater to the needs of the students. Currently, JLU School of Law is running LL.M. in three different streams i.e. Corporate and IP Laws, Cyber Laws and Cyber Security and Criminal Law and Criminal Justice.

OBJECTIVE:

- The basic agenda of LL.M. is to provide an academically rich atmosphere to the students so as to enable them to gather deeper insight into specific fields of law
- The course intends to prepare the students for academic and research field as well as to foster the professional needs of a law graduate

ELIGIBILITY:

Undergraduate degree in Law from an institute affiliated to a university or any university recognized by UGC/BCI, with a minimum of 50% or its equivalent. Admission will be on the basis CLAT Score card and a personal interview. For students who have not appeared for CLAT, a separate university entrance exam shall be conducted followed by a personal interview.

The distinctive features of the M.Phil. and Ph.D. Programmes are their multi-disciplinary orientation in both course design and teaching plan; its substantive academic content; its distinctiveness and its coherence as a programme of study with a policy orientation.

The objectives of the M.Phil./ Ph.D. Programme in Law include the following:

1. To prepare candidates for doctoral research in public policy and socio-legal research
2. To provide an inter-disciplinary perspective on the study of law
3. To equip students with the skills necessary to undertake research in areas of Law, including a special focus on the legal implications of these issues, by developing their expertise in these diverse disciplinary areas, and so to enable a more complex and multifaceted approach to issues of governance, public policy and law.

ELIGIBILITY AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Admission to the M.Phil/Ph.D. Programme is by an entrance examination conducted by the University followed by a viva-voce of the qualified candidates. The eligibility conditions for taking the entrance examination are a Masters Degree in Law with 55% from a recognized University. The test is aimed to evaluate the candidate's analytical abilities and competence.

Honorable Justice M. Jaichandren

Judge, Madras High Court

September 20, 2015

Honorable Justice M. Jaichandren shared his experiences of judiciary and guided students on ways to prepare for a successful career in litigation. He appreciated the School for providing state of the art Moot-Court, Legal Aid Clinic, and Library equipped with online legal databases. He also recalled his law school days when such facilities were not available. He then advised them to make most of such facilities to shape their career as a successful lawyer.




Mr. Ram Jethmalani

June 13, 2015



PLACEMENTS & INTERNSHIPS AT JLU



CENTRE FOR GOOD GOVERNANCE, LAW AND POLICY

Good governance is an ideal which is difficult to achieve in its totality; very few countries, societies, or organizations have even come closer. However, to ensure sustainable human development, actions must be taken to work towards this ideal. The aim of our study is to develop an adequate and complete understanding of the interaction between levels of governance, shifts in the power of political and judicial institutions. The goal of the research consists in rethinking democracy, constitutional rights and rule of law across all relevant levels of governance. Our objective is to study legal and regulatory instruments, principles and conflict rules through the lens of substantive and procedural legitimacy and the vertical dimension of multilevel governance is to understand better how they function and assess whether they are or can become innovative instruments in the achievement of legitimate multilevel governance. Our aim is to contribute to building knowledge in the field through publications of widespread international and national recognition. Workshops and training sessions will be conducted by eminent personalities.

CENTRE FOR INTERNATIONAL COMMERCIAL ARBITRATION AND ALTERNATIVE DISPUTE RESOLUTION (ADR)

The aim of the Alternative Dispute Resolution Centre is the advancement of research, scholarship and education in the fields of negotiation, mediation and arbitration. Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) is currently an area of substantial growing importance in many legal jurisdictions. The use of arbitration is well established, but there are a number of issues to be addressed in ensuring that the process is as efficient and effective as it might be. Increase in the use of mediation is being driven by a variety of factors, including the desire for quicker, more private and more cost-effective ways to resolve civil disputes. This Centre is an opportunity for the students to step out of the classroom and engage with the community. All new mediators will have the opportunity to mediate Small Claims court disputes, Harassment Prevention Order requests, and ad hoc dispute resolution cases. It is composed of staff as well as community members, including professionals and students. This course on Alternative Dispute Resolution Mechanism is an attempt to embrace dispute resolution methods and techniques that act as a means for incompatible parties to reach an agreement without resorting to litigation, which is a lengthy and time consuming process.

CENTRE FOR COMPETITION AND INVESTMENT LAWS, POLICY AND RESEARCH

Competition law is a contemporary and relevant field of research which has been analyzed from both global and national perspectives. The study in Competition Law programme offers you the opportunity to study the application of competition law in relation to different business phenomenon, ranging from anti-competitive agreements and abusive dominance to mergers, acquisitions, amalgamations and takeovers. Competition law is an exciting and important area of law, particularly in the international sphere. Students will also have an opportunity to explore the interface between competition law and allied areas such as intellectual property rights and trade.

CENTRE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS AND GENDER JUSTICE

Gender-based violence is often a common element of conflict and authoritarian regimes. In these contexts, impunity for violations against women is pervasive. At the same time, women are often absent or underrepresented in efforts to address such abuse. Recent developments in international law on gender-based violations and resolutions have strengthened the international community's commitment to combating these crimes. However, despite these advances, there has been limited success in prosecuting crimes of gender violence at the domestic or international level. Our research aims to provide new insights into how the gender dynamics of conflict can be addressed by transitional justice. For example, we have examined how sexual minorities are specifically targeted for human rights violations by state actors and armed groups, and how often these victims are invisible in transitional justice processes. The study will assess the benefits, risks, and limitations of human rights based approaches (HBRAs) to development, which can be catalogued on the basis of the institutional mechanisms they rely on: global compliance based on international and regional treaties; the policies and programming of donors and executive agencies; rights talk; and legal mobilization. As a part of their course students will be given opportunity to participate in camps, workshops, training sessions and seminars etc.

CENTRE FOR BUSINESS AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY LAWS

Intellectual property is the area of law that deals with protecting the rights of those who create original works. It covers everything from original plays and novels to inventions and company identification marks. The purpose of intellectual property laws is to encourage new technologies, artistic expressions and inventions while promoting economic growth. When individuals know

that their creative work will be protected and that they can benefit from their labor, they are more likely to continue to produce things that create jobs, develop new technology, make processes more efficient, and create beauty in the world around us. There are three main mechanisms for protecting intellectual property: copyrights, patents and trademarks. Intellectual property management encompasses creation, protection and exploitation of Intellectual Property Rights. Patents play a critical role in research and development of intensive industries. Patent rights are known to provide significant benefits as they can be sold or licensed and form foundation for making, using and selling industry leading products, processes and services. In order to obtain valid patent rights, however, basic knowledge of certain critical issues is considered essential among stakeholders. We will be conducting extensive training programme, seminars, lectures by eminent personalities, faculty development programmes, brain storming session etc. as a part of this Centre. Through several global case studies, the course introduces some practical legal concepts, pitfalls and compliances that are needed by today's businesses to comply with Competition Law, IPRs and their legal linkages. This advance course provides dual benefits of learning Competition Law & IPRs challenges faced by Corporations when they expand in an organic or non-organic manner into new territories, markets and products.



CENTRE FOR ENERGY, INFRASTRUCTURAL AND TRANSPORT LAWS

Infrastructure sector is a key driver for the Indian economy. The sector is highly responsible for propelling India's overall development and enjoys intense focus from Government for initiating policies that would ensure time-bound creation of world class infrastructure in the country. Infrastructure sector includes power, bridges, dams, roads and urban infrastructure development. In August 2016, India jumped 19 places in World Bank's Logistics Performance Index (LPI) 2016, to rank 35th amongst 160 countries. The Government of India has made a record allocation Rs 221,246 crore (US\$ 33.07 billion) for several infrastructure projects in Union Budget 2016-17, which is expected to provide significant boost to Indian infrastructure sector. Given the huge gap between potential and current air travel penetration in India, the prospects and possibilities of growth of Indian aviation market are enormous. The course aims at creating the awareness about Energy laws, Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016, The Electricity Act, 2003. This is an innovative and emerging area of research in the field of law. Sufficient research and study in this area has been undertaken abroad but Jagran Lakecity University, Bhopal is the first university in India to offer study in infrastructural laws.

CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL LAW AND CLIMATE CHANGE

"We the People" are the integral part of Environment and today it is important to understand that Human Rights are directly or indirectly affected if our environment degrades. To address these issues, The JLU-School of Law came up with an initiative for the advancement of legal education, research and governance in the dynamic fields of Environmental Law and established The goal of our centre is to sensitize the students and each section of the society to think responsibly about the present challenges our environment is facing due to the sudden competitive activities among the various nations. Also, it is a platform which encourages protection of right to environment for the future generations.

The aim of our centre is to promote environmental consciousness and conduct legal and interdisciplinary policy relevant research activities, advocate for the causes relating to environment protection, sustainable development and its education through field work. The centre will analyze the public policies of national and international level on climate change, health, water laws, wild life protection, natural resource management, indigenous people and environment impact assessment etc., to check its implementation in real sense. Apart from academic knowledge, to make our law students aware about the technicalities of the area for some possible legal solutions on contemporary environmental challenges there will be events like environmental studies, workshops, panel discussions by prominent environment experts, green law guest lecture series, seminars, conferences, sensitization through collaboration with different stakeholders for research and training program on Climate Change & International Environment Law.

CENTRE FOR CRIMINOLOGY, VICTIMOLOGY AND COMPENSATORY JURISPRUDENCE

'Victimology and compensatory jurisprudence' is the social science of victims, of victimizations and of reaction to both. It comprises much more than the relationships between victims and offenders. Victimology deals with the individual suffering of victims. Victims have to undergo various aspects in criminal justice perspective, media, societal relations etc. It also includes study of victim of crime and everything that is concerned with such victim such as the right to Restitution, compensation, assistance and right to access to justice and fair treatment.

The criminal justice system in India is focused primarily on punishment without giving much attention to the suffering of victims of crime. This lacuna has been sorted out in plethora of cases where the apex court has awarded compensation to the victims. However, the problem related to victims still continues to rise.

In order to overcome these situations there is need to mobilize public opinion and sensitize criminal justice administrator to persuade the government and law makers to provide a comprehensive legal framework for assistance and compensatory relief to victims so as to protect their Human Rights.

This centre is established to undertake advanced study and research in the emerging areas of victimology and compensatory jurisprudence.

CENTRE FOR PROFESSIONAL LEGAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING

The centre for Professional Legal Education and Training is specially geared to train and prepare students for competitive exams like, Judicial services, civil services, NET, SET, CLAT and other competitive exams of like nature with an objective of making students industry ready.

The primary objective of this centre is to mentor, motivate, guide and accompany our students in their educational journey, till they cross the milestone of their coveted goal. The centre will engage those students who exhibit interest to crack competitive exam. In order to bring out the aptitude and analytical skills of the students to help them face competitive exams with ease the centre will provide them regular coaching on the subjects as well as training to enhance their communication skills by experts. The centre will also make the students aware for opportunities available to them and also conduct mock exam on regular basis.

The ultimate aim of this centre is to make the students bloom like flowers and carry the aroma of freshness of their ideas and creativity wherever they go.

CENTRE FOR SPORTS LAW, POLICY & RESEARCH

Sports Law is one of the few areas of law which is still in the developing stages. Earlier, sport was pursued as a hobby but in the present scenario it has become a dedicated profession and is also an area of business. The Centre for Sports Law, Policy & Research at JLU School of Law focuses on research and provides legal assistance with respect to the issues in existing laws and policies in India related to Sports as a profession as well as commercial activity. In the modern world, sports as a profession and Commercial activity generally interacts with various legal disciplines such as Constitutional Law, Law of Contract, Law of Torts, Criminal Law, Taxation Law, Labour Law, Competition Law, and Intellectual Property Rights. The Centre plans to conduct lectures, workshops, conferences on Sports Law and Policy.

CENTRE FOR HEALTH AND MEDICINE LAWS

A healthy population can undoubtedly contribute to economic growth and development of a country. India has made considerable progress in many health indicators. Life expectancy at birth has increased, infant mortality and crude death rates have been greatly reduced, diseases such as small pox, polio and guinea worm have been eradicated, and leprosy has been nearly eliminated. All this is possible only because of the hard work of those involved in the medical sector.

Medical Profession is one of the oldest professions and most humanitarian one. Doctors in India are treated as second life savers after God. The standard of care from doctors and hospital authority is expected to be more in comparison with other cases of negligence. In today's scenario importance of Health and Medical law cannot be denied. But good medical facility is still a dream for much of the population of India. Government of India is trying hard to provide Universal Health Coverage to its whole population and for the same Ayushman Bharat Mission has been launched.



MOOT COURT



A method of teaching law and legal skills that requires students to analyze and argue both sides of a hypothetical legal issue using procedures modeled after those employed in state and federal appellate courts.

Moot court requirements at School of law, Jagran Lakecity University, Bhopal mandates that students participate at least once in a moot court argument before receiving their law degree. School of law schools offer right from the first year a series of moot court opportunities for students of differing skill levels and legal interests. The activity is competitive by nature, and students vie for honors within their school and in regional and national moot court competitions featuring teams of students from several law schools. Moot Court helps students learn to analyze legal issues; its larger purpose is to teach students the practical side of practicing law. Typically, law students are given a detailed hypothetical fact scenario that raises one or more legal issues. Often these fact patterns are based on real cases on appeal to a state's highest court or the Supreme Court. Students choose or are assigned the position on the issue to be argued. They then conduct legal research, finding statutes, regulations, and case law that both support their position and detract from it. An important part of the moot court process is to teach students to overcome legal authority (statutes, regulations, and cases) that cuts against their position.

Further, students then draft appellate briefs, which are formal legal papers combining a recital of the facts of the case with analysis and argument of the legal issues raised. As with real appellate courts, moot courts generally dictate many specific requirements for a brief, including the size of the paper, the width of the margins, and the maximum number of pages.

Once the briefs are written, students prepare for the second phase of moot court advocacy: oral argument. Oral argument demands preparation, organization, and the ability to think quickly and respond convincingly when questioned. The student appears before the panel of judges (typically law professors, actual judges, or other students) and presents her or his position on the legal issue. Each student has a time limit, normally five to ten minutes, to convince the panel. As with real appellate courts, judges on the panel are free to interrupt the student advocate frequently and at any time to ask questions about the facts of the case, legal authority for or against the student's position, or the student's thoughts and opinions about the cases out-come. Students learn to anticipate difficult questions about their legal position and respond intelligently and persuasively. Following oral argument, the moot court panel often will review the student's performance.

Moot court is modeled after the appellate procedure employed in state and federal courts. Moot court is sometimes confused with mock trials, a similar learning method by which students conduct a jury trial based on a hypothetical fact pattern. Where moot court emphasizes legal research, analysis, writing, and oratory, mock trials emphasize jury persuasion techniques and a thorough familiarity with the rules of evidence.



As per the mandate of the Rules of Legal Education 2008, School of Law has established a Legal Aid Clinic that fulfills every expectation as required. The purpose behind having this Clinic is to familiarize law students with the problems faced by those people who are either uninformed or ignorant about their rights under the law and to teach them skills to help such people. Legal Aid Clinic is recognized by the Legal Aid Services Authority, Bhopal. Dr. Yash Tiwari, Assistant Professor, is the faculty in charge of the Legal Aid Clinic.

Legal Aid Clinic serves two-fold purpose, first is to provide free legal services to economically weaker people and second, to direct the energies of the students in contributing to the society. The members of the Legal Aid Clinic are engaged in spreading legal awareness in rural areas through street plays as well as legal aid camps where they make the target population aware of different laws. The senior faculty members have chalked out a thorough activity plan for Legal Aid Clinic which also contains learning exposure through visiting Courts, Tribunals, Forums etc. Through Legal Aid Clinic, School of Law Faculty and Students have channeled their knowledge and energy to work at the grassroots.

Legal Aid Clinic believes in students becoming the torch bearers of its activities and promotes initiatives taken by them. Students under the supervision of the faculty can assist the people seeking legal advice. They may even bring the matter before the legal service authorities, if needed.

As he Barrister, he has acted for government of Belize, Bermuda and Trinidad (and was the first non-QC to have been admitted at the Trinidad Bar) undertaking commercial litigation. VISIT OF PROF. PETER KUZNICK

BRIEF INTRODUCTION OF PROF. PETER KUZNICK
